I. Specifics of the Deployment

Deployment / Location

Railroad Park Lewiston Maine

Date and Time

Saturday October 12th 0700 to 1300

Sunday October 13th 0600 to 1700

Rally Point

The Continental Mill located at 88 Oxford St and is designated as the rally point for both days of this deployment; all team members will meet at the rally point NLT than the times indicated above. Team members will arrive and depart from this location. Team members assigned to SAG vehicles must be ready to deploy by 0630 on Sunday so it's imperative that all team members arrive on time so we can brief and begin to moving team members out.

In addition the Continental Mill is also designed as the rally point if an evacuation from Railroad Park is ordered or if team members are required to shelter in place

Mission:

The Dempsey Challenge is charity event where participants will bike, run or walk to raise money that will benefit the Patrick Dempsey Center for Cancer, Hope, and Healing at Central Maine Medical Center. The event will include a 5K and 10K run / walk on Saturday October 12th and a 100, 50, 25, and 10 mile bicycle ride on Sunday October 13th. Please note the times are tentative and schedule to change.

This will be the 5th year Maine Task Force One has been invited to deploy and provide medical coverage for this event.

Saturday October 12th

A small contingent of team members will deploy and stage at Railroad Park to be available in the event

Sunday October 13th

- Rest Stop # 2 / Medical Tent will located at Thomas Moser Furniture
- Provide 4-5 team members to conduct roving patrols in Railroad Park
- 1-2 team members will staff the SAG vehicles

Uniforms

BDU Pants and Blue T-Shirts

Blue Tactical shorts are appropriate if the weather permits

Be sure to bring appropriate outer garments in the event of cold or wet weather

Accountability

- All team members will check in and out with the Team Admin Officer in the morning and check out at the end of the deployment with Task Force Operations
- Roving patrols will provide periodic (hourly updates) to Task Force Operations
- Medical Group Leader assigned to Treatment Area Two will report to Task Force Operations when their treatment area has been established and they are ready to receive patients.

Level of Care

Basic first aid will be provided to spectators and participants. Anyone who requires care beyond this level will be stabilized and immediately transported to Central Maine Medical Center or St. Mary's Regional Medical Center for further evaluation and treatment. There will be three ambulances on the course specifically for patient transports.

Communications

Hand held radios will be issued to Group Leader of Treatment Area 2 and to the Roving Patrols for the purpose of communicating among team members to provide periodic updates as well as to ensure communication is available during an MCI or other significant event. Frequencies will be determined the day of the event. All Me TF1 members are reminded to follow proper radio etiquette at all times.

An amateur radio operator will be assigned to each medical station and all requests for patient evacuation will be made through the amateur radio operator to the incident commander located at Railroad Park.

Treatment Areas

Maine Task Force One's Zumuro will be deployed to the 2nd rest stop at Kitty Hawke junction to establish medical treatment areas on the course.

The Androscoggin County Mass Casualty Incident (MCI) Trailer will be pre-positioned at the race for use in the event of an MCI or other significant incident.

Meal Rotation

A volunteer group located at Thomas Mosher Furniture will be providing a hot meal of hot dogs and hamburgers and Task Force Operations will be responsible for rotating team members

Injuries

Team members will immediately report all injuries no matter how slight to Task Force Operations or to the Team Commander

Mass Casualty Incident

In the event that a mass casualty incident or other significant incident occurs during this deployment, the Medical Group Leader assigned to Rest Stop 2 will immediately begin making preparations to deploy back to the team rally point.

Unless otherwise specified, the central rally point for this event is the Continental Mill located at 88 Oxford St. All team members will stage there and wait assignment from Task Force Command

Team member safety and situational awareness is paramount during an MCI

- Do not enter the scene until the scene is secured by the fire department or law enforcement
- Minimize the number of team members who enter the incident, all patients should be brought through a casualty collection point for triage
- Exit the way you entered if practical
- Be aware of your surroundings; have an exit identified at all times
- Also be aware of hazards that could injure you, your patient, or other rescuers
- Only disrupt the scene enough to provide patient care and extrication
- Minimize communications via hand held radio
- Utilize whistles to indicate potentially hazardous situations
- Utilize your whistle to signal an unsafe or hazardous situation
- Be aware of multiple devices and potential perpetrators posing as patients
